# TOWN OF BALDWIN TOWN BOARD MEETING JANUARY 12, 2022

**THIS REGULAR MEETING** of the Town of Baldwin was held at the Town of Baldwin Town Hall and called to order at approximately 6:14 p.m. by Supervisor Purvis. Those present were Councilwoman Purvis, Councilman Conklin, Councilman Collins and Councilman Smith.

Also present were Faith Marmor, Robin Rosekrans, Paul Tillotson and Anna Pirro.

#### PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public comments.

#### **COUNTY LEGISLATURE**

The County Legislature was not in attendance and no report was given.

## **MINUTES**

A Motion was made to accept the December 8, 2021 Public Hearing Minutes by Councilman Conklin, seconded by Councilman Collins, All Ayes.

A Motion was made to accept the December 8, 2021 Town Board Meeting Minutes by Councilman Conklin, seconded by Councilman Collins, All Ayes.

#### SUPERVISOR

Barb Harding gave Supervisor Purvis a sheet with 2021 Expenditures vs. Appropriations, giving an idea as to what is budgeted and what is actually spent out of the budget. Last year, \$744,424.00 budgeted, minus the Baldwin Fire Department amount, and we had spent \$635,061.00. The Town went under what was budgeted by \$109, 363.00. The cash flow deposits were \$610,359.00 and we had expenses of \$635,061.00 and these expenses include the \$35,000.00 set aside for health insurance. If this \$35,000.00 is taken out, because very little has been used, we are pretty close to having a balanced budget. The difference is \$24,702.00 and we have \$35,000.00 in that account. If we did not use \$10,000.00 of this account, we are actually in the black. If the town operations continue as 2021, the account extra will last approximately 18 years and this is counting the \$35,000.00 in the health account that is not being used. Inflation could changes things though. At least we have some idea that we are not in the red as bad as a lot of people think. This sheet is attached to these minutes.

Terie Huseby gave Supervisor Purvis a summary regarding property and school taxes and percentage the town actually receives. If you are in the Elmira School District, of all the taxes collected, the Town only gets 12.53%. Everything else goes to the County and School, and only 3.94% goes to the Fire

Department. Horseheads School District is 13.61% that the Town gets out of all the taxes collected. Spencer Van Etten School District is 13.91% that the Town gets out of all the taxes collected. Waverly School District is 15.39% that the Town gets out of all the taxes collected. Waverly School District is the most inexpensive School District of the four school districts. *This summary is attached to these minutes.* 

Supervisor Purvis received a letter concerning the Town Justice needing to produce an Annual Report and this must be audited by the Board and in the Minutes. He will contact Judge Spencer to obtain this Annual Report.

The grant money was approved by the County in the amount of \$2,000.00 towards the town park fence.

We received confirmation that the State received Local Law No. 1 of 2021 (Cannabis Dispensaries and Consumption Sites). More than 400 towns in New York State have opted out.

As to COVID funds, one time a year we have to submit an expenditure statement to the State on how this money was used in the Town.

Supervisor Purvis commented that Foley (drug testing) has a program where they will keep track of all the required CDL things that need to be reported to the Department of Transportation and the cost for the first year is \$194.00 per driver and then \$125.00 per driver every year after that. A Motion was made in the form of a **Resolution No. 14-2022 (1R-2022)** to approve and obtain the Foley Clearing House Program and pay the fees associated with same by Supervisor Purvis, seconded by Councilman Collins, All Ayes.

We received the Assessment cost for Comp Alliance in the amount of \$403.00. This amount was revised to a lower amount and resubmitted to the Town Clerk and put in with the bills for this meeting.

As to the Sticker Sales (trading of stickers for marijuana) in Chemung County, the State says this is illegal, however Mustico Law Office states that he was informed that the D.A. is not enforcing/prosecuting sales of Stickers.

Chemung County is not enforcing the mask mandate.

## TOWN CLERK

The Town Clerk 2021 Annual Report is attached to these minutes.

Faith Marmor read an email she received from the County Treasurer's Office as to an issue with the 2022 Tax Bills. *This email and attached notice is attached to these minutes.* 

## HIGHWAY

Paul Tillotson reported that the Highway Department has done some ditching on Bartlett and Little roads. They hauled in some sand for roads. We had some snow storms and a good ice storm. The Highway Department had the '95 Volvo go down, power steering line and drive shaft. This is up and

running again. They just changed out a hub assembly on the Ten Wheeler today and this truck is up and running as well.

Faith - This email is to advise you of an issue with 2022 Tax Bills. The issue does not impact amounts owed or due on the face of the bill, but does impact Tax Levy Change information presented on the tax bills for the Town of Baldwin. The issue is isolated to Tax Levy change amounts in districts where the % change was a negative and double digit change. The RPS file from Real Property Office that was loaded into the BOCES bill printing system had the correct % amounts, but the BOCES bill printing system did not have enough spaces available in the field to carry the entire negative double digit change, therefore the system defaulted these changes to 0.0 as you can see on the attached Notice in the "ORIGINAL" Section. This has never happened before to my knowledge, and it was not detected prior to the 2022 tax bills being printed and mailed out.

## Community College

The current plan is (1) to send out the attached notice to all taxpayers that received a tax bill with the incorrect tax levy change %, and (2) to change the tax bill review process going forward so that each field with data is verified by County and BOCES and Towns. The Notice indicates for inquiries to come to this office.
