TOWN OF BALDWIN TOWN BOARD MEETING OCTOBER 11, 2023

THIS REGULAR MEETING of the Town of Baldwin was held at the Town of Baldwin Town Hall and called to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. by Supervisor Purvis. Those present were Councilwoman Purvis, Councilman Smith and Councilman Collins. Councilman Conklin was absent.

Also present were Paul Tillotson, Anna Pirro, Faith Marmor, Robin Rosekrans, Barb Harding and Joe Donovan.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Robin Rosekrans asked the following:

- 1. How are the yearly reports coming? Barb Harding said that she is sending 2019 out next week, she has a little imbalance issue and she has to get that resolved before she can send it.
- 2. How does the Budget for 2023 look, is the Town in the black or close to the red? Barb Harding stated that overall as of the end of September, she believes we are at about a negative \$8,000.00. The budget itself is kind of deceiving because we do not use all the money that is in the budget, so as far as the budget is concerned the Town is still fine, as far as what was proposed for 2023. However, she is looking at pnl's and saying we are short, which is understandable because last year we had extra income that we do not have this year for 2023. We may be just fine because the sales tax still seems to be pretty consistent. If she had to say, she would say we might be a little on the negative side by the end of the year but not anything drastic. Ms. Rosekrans asked if we should maybe look at having an increase in taxes? Barb Harding stated that her tax increase was like \$4,500.00 that is allowed without special consideration to ask. The only thing she finds probably with that issue is that we still are maintaining almost a half a million dollars in cash assets, liquidity, and even though we may be running the year at a small negative, we still have the money in the bank accounts. She thinks there would be an issue trying to raise taxes with the idea that we are probably one of the most liquid entities in the area, she is assuming. She thinks with the budget she has tried to add more revenues in this year for 2024 because there has been years when she has not put revenues in certain spots because she hated to think okay we are going to get this money and then maybe we do not. Really our General budget has not changed that much, this year Code Enforcement was the only one that asked for somewhat of a raise as he has not had one since starting at the Town, he asked for \$1,000.00 and this is split between Zoning and Fire, but this is up to the Board too whether or not this is something they can do. There was a pick up a little for what is going to be charged to do the taxes and the Election went up a lot (there are 3 Elections next year though). It is really helping having the HRA. This is the only thing that really makes it hard with the medical because if we had to fund it all over again, then this next year would be \$40,000.00 vs. \$35,000.00 as it has gone up. However, there is more than enough appropriated for health insurance. The budget is just an estimate. The only things that are really concrete are wages.

- 3. The health insurance premium percentage that County employees pay for is going from 10% to 12% and she is asking that the Town consider this increase or an increase as well for the Town of Baldwin employees. Barb Harding did state that rather than increasing this, maybe the Town wants to talk about full funding because the single is going from \$7,000.00 to \$8,000.00 and family is going to \$16,000.00, now it is \$7,000.00 and \$14,000.00. Before the Highway employees would get hit with anything, they would have to pay out \$14,000.00, the town picks up the first \$14,000.00 with the HRA. To fully fund this is \$40,000.00. Does the town leave this at \$35,000.00, fully fund at \$40,000.00 and leave the percentage at 10%?
- 4. Can the moneys from the County be applied to the cemetery upkeep? Supervisor Purvis stated that Brandon Stanton (the District Representative) from the Department of State, Division of Cemeteries, is who we should speak with regarding the cemetery. The cemeteries must be registered with the State Department. Joe Donovan stated that the only thing that he gets involved with is leaning of the headstones as they are a safety hazard, if they fall they are not covered and the responsibility then falls on the Town. Cemeteries go broke and when this happens a Town has to legally take over a cemetery. The only thing the State does is hazards in a cemetery, everything else reverts back to the Town.

LEGISLATURE

Mr. Donovan stated that money from the County is going to be distributed to each township and this money will have to be used for things Chips money is currently used for, ie mainly roads, this amount will depend on the mileage of the roads and shape/condition of the roads, there will be variables with this money. If the Town needs to make out an application, it will get one, he will keep us informed.

MINUTES

A Motion was made to accept the September 13, 2023 Town Board Meeting Minutes by Councilwoman Purvis, seconded by Councilman Smith, All Ayes.
